ZSEA on a Mission - *Connecting communities to nature for conservation*

Banham Zoo and its sister zoo Africa Alive! have sought to amaze and inspire our guests over many years, providing wonderful and memorable days out for generations. In itself this is a vital role; ensuring that we have quality time for family bonding and social interactions but the creation of the charity – the Zoological Society of East Anglia - meant that we needed to fulfil greater purpose than just being a successful visitor attraction. Conservation is what drives us but at the very heart of what we do is bringing people and animals closer together. Society is now officially urban – more people live in towns and cities than in rural areas. ZSEA zoos have a unique ability to build bridges between people and animals and have incredible power to inspire individuals to become advocates for the natural world.

Successful conservation is very much about involving and working with local communities. Animals really bring the best out of people so where better to build on that natural bond than in the safe and glorious environment of our ZSEA zoos. These “havens” can be ideal places for many different groups to come together for renewed purpose or friendship. It is vital to remember that nature should be for all and our ambition is very much that our zoos become the most accessible and inclusive of visitor destinations in the UK.

With strong communities and the feeling of positivity in one’s life balance, people are more open and have capacity to fulfil more of their intrinsic need for deeper connection with the natural world. This is the next leg of our conservation journey. At our zoos we can teach all generations about everything from art to zoology and the zoo is the most dynamic and unique of classrooms. Our ambition is to go much farther than just teaching, it is about engendering a much deeper emotional connection to nature.

Our zoos offer so many ways that you can work for nature and support nature which leads perfectly into wanting to care and act for animals. ZSEA conservation work will be focused on long term investment in animals like the fabulous blue-eyed black lemur from Madagascar and we intend to expand our remit to value and extol the wonders of own natural habitat and work to improve the status of native species.

Garden Jottings from Ken



It's a scary time of year... bodies lurking in the undergrowth, waiting for a quiet moment to carry out their nefarious deeds, vandals and thieves creeping about your garden... watch out and beware of things that go munch in the night! Ok, they might look cute, but rabbits and deer can be an absolute menace in the garden. It's not always easy to live in harmony with some of our stunning wildlife, but as we encroach further into their habitats then a degree of tolerance should be allowed. It's always better to work with Mother Nature than try to defeat her, but by making some adjustments to your garden the balance may be tipped in your favour.

If you really don't want them intruding you need to do something to keep them out, and a physical barrier such as a fence will do nicely. Rabbits are good at digging, so a small-holed wire fence about 1 metre high with more being buried at an angle facing out from the garden will prevent them from burrowing underneath. Deer are very athletic and will need a 2 metre barrier to exclude the larger species. Fencing may be an option for small to medium gardens, but the cost may be excessive on larger areas, so consider creating an enclosed sanctuary close to the house for treasured plants.

Wildlife will only visit your garden if you provide something they desire (usually food), and by using plants that are less palatable you may reduce damage. Choices such as privet, box, Viburnum tinus, yew and holly make worthwhile resistant hedges. Shrubs including ribes, hypericum, elaeagnus, choisya and acid-loving rhododendrons and azaleas will provide good border structure, whilst a selection of perennials such as anemone, persicaria, euphorbia, hardy geraniums, kniphofia, astilbe and eryngiums will provide colourful interest during the Summer. You could even slip in some cheerful daffodils and stunning hellebores (not niger varieties) to herald in the Spring.

Of course there's no accounting for taste, and in extreme conditions the urge to survive means that four-legged garden intruders may have a go at practically anything!

Richard explained his meaning of Hardy Exotics, hardy being any plant that can survive down to a temperature of 15C and exotic meaning any plant that has the characteristics of a foreign plant. He also explained that 'woody' plants adapt to the cold very well, also those plants with their roots planted below the 'frost line' (20cm) and mulched well for winter usually survive quite happily. Richard then went on to show slides and talk about some of his favourite exotics. Also mentioned were the 'Big Leafy Monsters' like Banana plants, Palms, Bamboos and Tree Ferns. Little by little the shops gear up for next month and some people have already gone beyond thinking what they're going to get for presents to actually buying them, the amount of time they're stored being longer than the amount of time they're remembered in some cases! Some gifts are eaten and forgotten, but still valuable in the course of life even so. Some gifts are treasured and remembered for years to come, even by descendants of those they were given to.

This month does not have the present giving event I allude to above, but it does have a giving event that is important for so many. Of course, the giving was more a grim determination in an effort at survival than an act of love, as people gave their all to produce food and clothes and weapons, while others 'at the front' fought each other with all the help those at home could supply. Although the ones back home 'gave their all' as I put it above, there are some who 'gave their lives' as those who were left would say, and those who were left committed themselves to remembering that gift both with stone and brass memorials, and also with huge effort to rebuild their countries shattered by war. The great economies of Europe, with a desire to work together for the good of all, were thus repaired and we have enjoyed great prosperity.

So we speak of giving in such different ways – sometimes referring to something sweet, sometimes to something very different. For those shopping for presents, let it be with joy and pleasure. For those giving to care for relatives or sick

neighbours, where the giving can sometimes feel more like grim determination and a fight against what life has thrown your way, pause for thought. Don't let it be that these demands tear your life from you but remember how you will be remembered – as one who 'gave their life' for another. Thinking of it this way may help you to give freely, out of love rather than necessity, and when that burden is yours no more then you may be remembered for the grace you showed in your loving. I have as my example of course, Jesus, who gave his life that I might live. He inspires me to do the same. Steve Wright

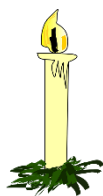

Lead thefts from Norfolk's Church roofs - A scheme to help protect Norfolk's churches from the threat of lead theft has been praised by the Police and Crime Commissioner after police figures showed nearly 50 per cent fall in such crimes since its launch two years ago.

Through this partnership scheme the initial hope was to install 50 alarms on church buildings – some 71 have now been installed to date. Prior to the scheme introduction police recorded 48 incidents of lead thefts (between Oct 2015 and Aug 2017), following the launch (between Oct 2017 and Jul 2019) some 26 thefts have been reported – a near 50% fall. Roof Alarm Schemes, are important for tackling this crime and keeping these community and historic buildings safe.
