Garden Jottings from Ken



Our weather!! As a nation we're obsessed by it and we're certainly never happy with it, especially as extreme weather events become increasingly frequent. We shouldn't complain too much, just compare us with many other parts of the world. For those living in drought-prone countries, our rainfall would seem like fantasy. Our autumn gales could be described as 'a bit breezy' compared to the devastating hurricanes, typhoons and tornados can bestow on communities. We may sometimes get shaken in the night by a rumble of thunder, but no earthquakes or avalanches, not for us thankfully!

Our climate is pretty good overall, and it makes our land green and pleasant. If in the big picture things seem rosy, on a smaller scale as gardeners we have to overcome the challenges that nature provides us with. Whether it's poor soil, getting blasted by the wind, shade caused by trees or buildings, hot and dry or wet and soggy earth, no two gardens are the same, but all can become a special space to enjoy.

Tough sites need tough plants, good old-fashioned choices that are reliable and will provide structure to your borders, which as they mature may allow you to grow more delicate plants amongst them. Berberis, elaeagnus, viburnum, tamarix, spirea, lonicera and roses offer practically bomb-proof planting once they are established. Mix these with a suitable selection of herbaceous perennials such as leucanthemum, Japanese anemones, geraniums, kniphofia, crocosmia, hellebores and rudbeckia. All of these plants are available in a host of different varieties to bring dependable colour to your garden.

If your soil is really terrible then try growing out of the ground in pots. Cheerful pansies, dainty violas, cyclamen, primroses and polyanthus can be underplanted with spring-flowering bulbs, or possibly mixed with mini evergreens such as euonymus, euphorbia, heuchera or thyme to provide some welcome cheer through the winter months. Alternatively, use larger containers or raised beds and create some more permanent impact with a selection of stunning shrubs, climbers, grasses and perennials.

The meeting was on the hottest evening of the year and on leaving members were treated to a spectacular thunderstorm. Banham and Old Buckenham's 'golden opportunity' to join UK's full fibre broadband revolution - During well attended successful meetings in Banham and Old Buckenham last month County Broadband, a specialist provider based in East Anglia explained how our two villages can take advantage of their plans to roll out future-ready gigabit-capable full fibre network, offering ultrafast and hyperfast speeds to all businesses and households in the two villages. Find out more about their plans on www.countybroadband.co.uk/futureready.

In order for them to undertake this roll out they need at least 30% of residents and businesses in each village to commit now to pre-ordering the service to give the green light to start construction. The network would be installed in 2020 and be available to all premises.

This is a golden opportunity to get reliable fast broadband into our rural villages at a competitive price, but the opportunity will be missed if there are not enough people willing to sign up for the service.

- Pre-orders are needed by early September to take advantage of a free connection when the network is built (otherwise connection costs £225).
- Residents who order a connection will also be able to take advantage of the service for free if the network is built whilst they are still in contract, which means as County Broadband connect their homes, if they have pre-ordered, they won't be charged for their service until their existing contract with the incumbent provider has finished.
- If the uptake is achieved, County Broadband will also connect village and community facilities (such as village halls) and provide them with a broadband service free of charge.
